**About the College:** The glorious journey of 50 years of Shyama Prasad Mukherji College started with a humble beginning in the year 1969, in a small government building at Tagore Garden with only six programs, 500 students, and a handful of teaching and administrative staff. The college is named after the illustrious statesman and academician, Dr. Shyama Prasad Mukherji. The college has been shifted in its present location, Punjabi Bagh West, Delhi in October, 1985. At present, the college offers 19 programs including three professional courses and running nine Certificate Courses.

Today, the college takes great pride in its big campus spreading over 10 acres of land with two academic blocks, more than 100 rooms, 9 labs, 4 seminar rooms, an audio-visual room, a state-of-the-art auditorium with a seating capacity of 1150 people. The College has also very good sports infrastructure. It has indoor and outdoor gyms; a basketball and volleyball court; Kho-kho, Kabbaddi and hockey grounds. The college has a large, well-stocked, fully digitalised library with a collection of 87,000 books, 22 journals, 11 newspapers and air-conditioned reading-halls. It also has Staff quarters, a branch of the Indian Overseas Bank, an ATM, a Bookshop, and a Photo Copy shop in its campus.

**2. Major Activities and Achievements:**

SPMC had excelled its academic and co-curricular activities despite the covid 19 challenges. The college, under the supervision of IQAC and Research committee, carried out various activities such as 1 Professional Development Programme for Non-Teaching Staffs , 6 Workshops, 2 UGC sponsored National Seminars and 60 International Webinars, 2 Kabi Saamelans, 2 Graduate Students Paper Presentation, and various intercollege competitions despite all the challenges. Our faculty members published more than 70 books and chapters, and research articles and also presented more than 100 papers at various seminars, workshops and conferences.

SPMC was awarded GREEN CHAMPION AWARD and 4 teachers were awarded prestigious medals for their contributions in various fields. 4 students secured positions in University exam. 8 teachers were awarded Doctor of Philosophy.

SPMC is running added 3 Add-on Courses titled, Counselling and Psychotherapy, Diet and Wellness, Employability and Soft Skills in the academic year 2020-21. The institution is now offering 8 Add on Courses:

Kibo device reads and translates printed/ handwritten/ digital text in various Indian languages can store them in pdf and audio files.
