


Overview of the Program

The Faculty Development Programme on ‘Effective Teaching and Learning Practices’ was conducted in Shyama Prasad Mukherji College from 22-26 September, 2018. The event was attended by 64 College/University lecturers and research scholars from different Universities including University of Delhi. Sessions were addressed by subject-experts and academicians from multiple disciplines.

The Inaugural Session on 22nd September was effectively compered by Dr Gita Sharma (Programme Coordinator, FDP). The event was inaugurated with a lamp lighting ceremony by the Chief Guest, Prof. Girishwar Misra (Vice Chancellor, MGAHV – Wardha); the Guest of Honour, Prof. Anisur Rahman (Director, UGCHRDC, JMI), Patron, Dr Sadhna Sharma (Principal-Officiating) ; the FDP Convener, Ms. Ravi Mohan Ahuja, and the Co-Conveners.

In her welcome address, Dr. Sadhna Sharma emphasized the relevance of faculty development programmes in recent times marked by constant change in the character of students as well as the curriculum. She observed that teachers must always be learners.

Ms. Ravi Mohan Ahuja introduced the FDP by highlighting how necessary it was to constantly update one’s teaching techniques in the modern era of imparting education. She expressed hope that the programme would enable the participating teachers to reflect on and enhance the effectiveness of their pedagogical practices and research.

In his keynote address titled ‘Professional development of staff in higher education: Need of the nation’, Prof. Anisur Rahman highlighted the challenges that need to be addressed in order to achieve standards of excellence in higher education in India. His mapping of the larger socio-cultural context helped the participants put the entire programme in perspective.

The Chief Guest, Prof. Girishwar Misra, in his address titled ‘Perspectives on Effective Teaching-Learning Practices’, stated that the purpose of teaching and learning should be to ‘achieve well-being and happiness’. Effective teaching, he said, should empower the learner. In times of New Media, when the teacher is not the only source of knowledge, it is important to teach students *how* to learn. He concluded his address eloquently by telling the participating teachers: ‘*Logon ko supatra banao*’.

Total number of participants = 64


Feedback obtained = 55

The observations on basis of feedback responses is as follows :


- 87% participants rated the Course Modules as excellent and very good.

Pictorial Representation of Feedback Analysis






