Student Feedback Analysis Report (2022-2023)

DATA COLLECTION

A google form was created and distributed to students in an attempt to gather input on the teaching-learning environment in the college. It consists of 56 questions covering the following topics: teaching, infrastructure, placement and internship cell, administration, internal assessment, sports & co-curricular activities, and administration.

DATA ANALYSIS

Total responses that have been received are **417**.

CATEGORY 1 – TEACHING

The students were asked a total of 12 questions covering a range of topics, including knowledge of the concepts, guidance and encouragement for the students, and teaching style and material delivery.

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The following findings are drawn from the responses received:

- Students are satisfied with the institution's teaching and learning process.
- Teachers have good communication skills and encourage the students to participate in classroom discussions.
- Nonetheless, over 20% of students believe that teachers are unable to recognize their strengths and weaknesses and provide them with the appropriate feedback.

CATEGORY 2 – LIBRARY

Based on the questions asked on the library facilities provided to the students, the response analysis is shown in the below table.

Based on the feedback data collected, following observations are made:

- Approximately 23% of students have expressed dissatisfaction with the library's amenities.
- Concerns about not receiving instructions or training to use the library database have also been raised by the students. Over 53% of the students had trouble finding the required books in the library and using remote access to access the library database.

CATEGORY 3 – INTERNAL ASSESSMENT

To examine the effectiveness of the Internal Assessment System, 8 questions were asked to the students. The response analysis is depicted in the below table.

Following observations are made on the basis of the survey:

- 38% of students believe that modifications are necessary to the Internal Evaluation System.
- Approximately 30% of students expressed concern about the lack of regular assessment.
- In addition, there are two areas that need to be improved: discussing assignments and handling grievances from students.

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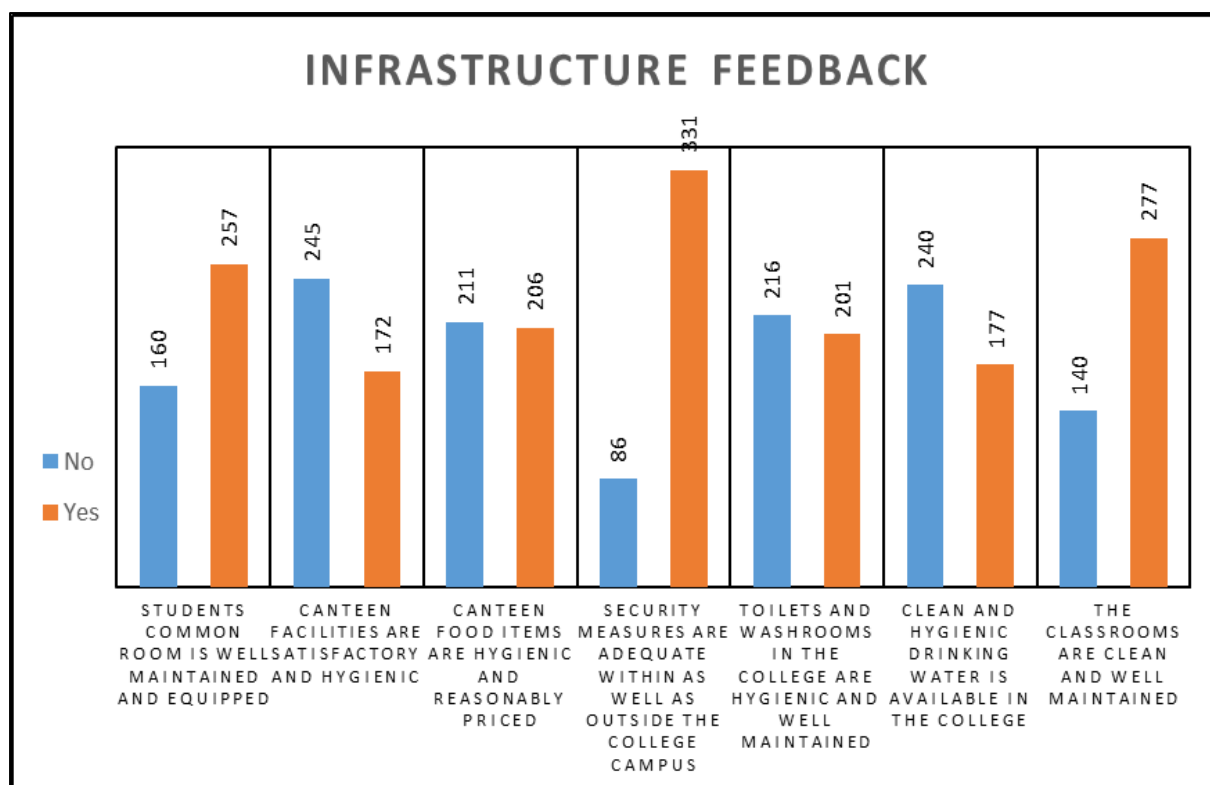

Observations made on the basis of the survey:

- Around 21% of the students feel healthcare facilities should be improved.
- Awareness about the counselling facilities should be improved as 29% of the students are not aware about such facilities.

CATEGORY 5 – INFRASTRUCTURE

The response analysis for the infrastructure category is depicted below.



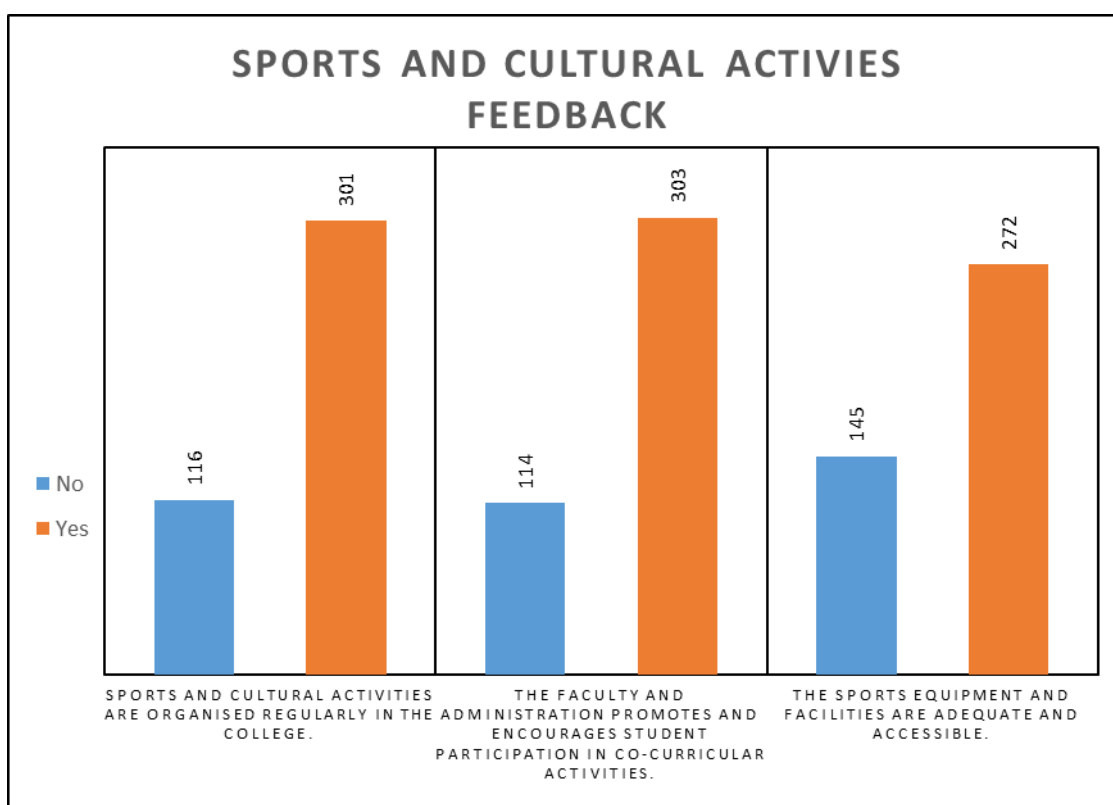
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Key observations:

- The primary concerns about the college's infrastructure are the availability of clean hygienic water and the upkeep of the restrooms.
- Students' express dissatisfaction with the canteen facilities, citing unhygienic food items as a reason.

CATEGORY 6 – SPORTS AND CO-CURRICULAR

Participation in co-curricular activities fosters a culture of healthy competition among students, which is why colleges encourage it. The chart below displays the response analysis for the category of sports and extracurricular activities.

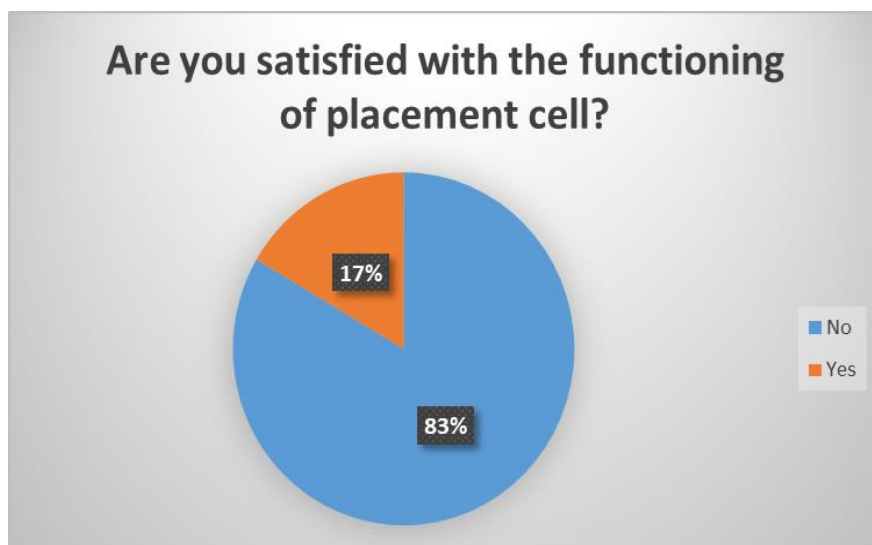


Key Observations:

- The college routinely organizes a number of sports and cultural programs to support students' holistic development.
- However, the sports facilities require improvements as 30% of the students feel that sports equipment and amenities are inadequate and not accessible.

CATEGORY 7 – PLACEMENT CELL

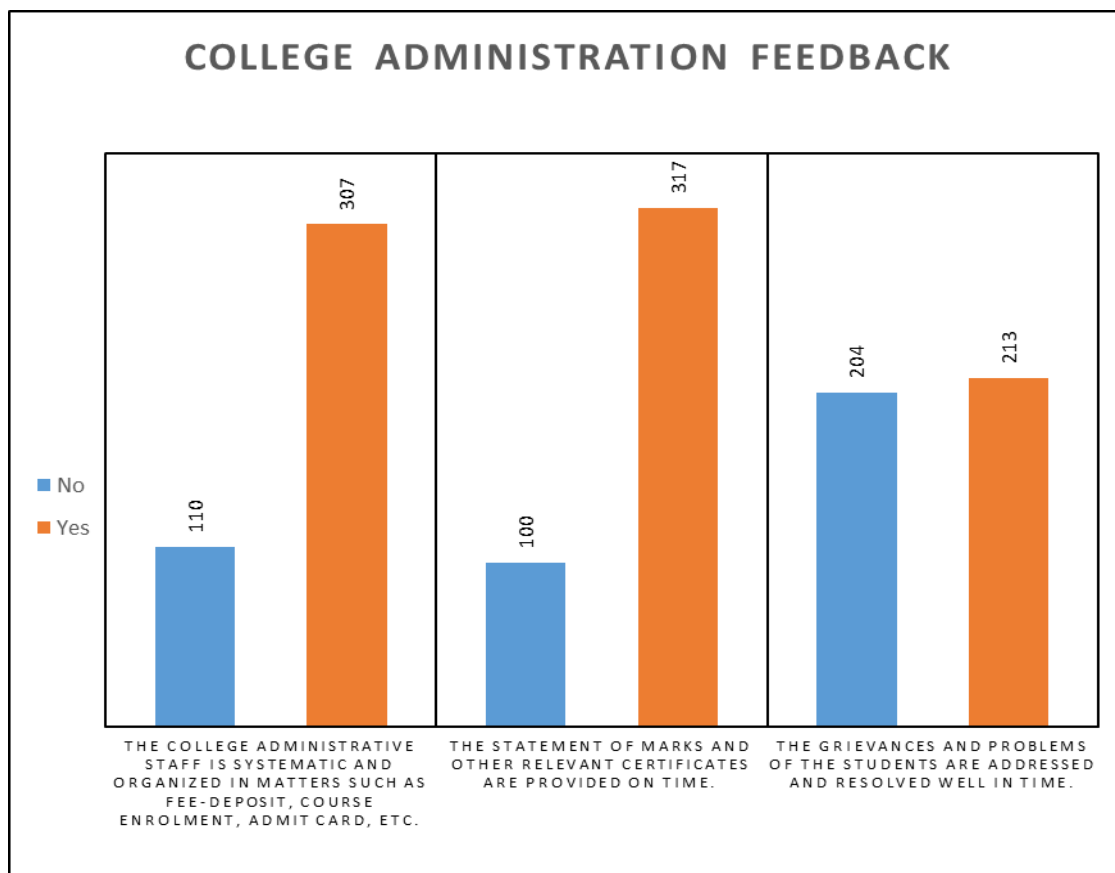
The feedback is depicted in the Pie-Chart below:



Key observations:

- More than 80% of the students have shown dissatisfaction with the functioning of placement cell.
- Only 18.46% of the students have registered for the placement cell. Awareness for the placement cell should be improved as most of the students are not aware of the placement cell. More than 70% of the students are not aware about the placement cell.
- Around 10% of the students have done internship in various companies.

CATEGORY 8 – ADMINISTRATION



Key observations based on administration feedback:

- College administrative staff is organised and systematic. However, around 20% of students have expressed concerns about working of administrative staff. Furthermore, the grievance addressal mechanism area also requires attention as around 49% of the responses received have shown dissatisfaction in this category.
