
NCERT Poster Making Competition





A Tribute to Dr. Sudipta Ghose

In an earlier issue we ran an interview piece with Dr. Sudipta Ghose. She retired after a long innings at the department that spanned over four decades. We take this opportunity to share with you some of her achievements over the years and some thoughts that her students have shared with us.

Dr. Sudipta Ghose is one of the founding members of the Department of Education at Shyama Prasad Mukherji College. In a career spanning four decades at this institution, Dr. Ghose has been a witness and catalyst in the metamorphosis of the Department of Education. From a department catering to the students of B.A. programme to one that concurrently offers specialization in education to undergraduate and postgraduate students, we have come a long way. Through all the ups and downs of the journey, Dr. Ghose has remained a pillar of strength.

As a faculty member, she undertook some notable initiatives for the department. The departmental magazine was one such collaborative effort with the students wherein their achievements and talents were recognized. Her vision of documenting students' details and providing a platform for students' expression has proved to be of immense value over time. Not one to rest on previous laurels, she raised the bar by successfully organizing an international conference on education in November 2017, with Dr. Kapur as the co convener. Be it the cover page of the department magazine, the placement of college logo on the book of abstracts, the menu of high tea or the seating and lunch arrangements for students, everything had her stamp. Meticulous almost to a fault, for her, there is no detail that is too small to overlook.





She has been an exceptional teacher, motivating her students to develop a scientific temper and to critically examine the established social practices and superstitions. Her role as a teacher has never been restricted to the boundaries of the classroom as her association with many of her students has blossomed into lifelong mentorship. Committed to promoting excellence, Dr. Ghose has always actively encouraged students to seek learning opportunities beyond the confines of the curriculum.

Dr. Ghose was the visiting professor at Utica College in United States where she taught papers on Inclusive Education Classroom Practices at the Master's level. As the scholar in her couldn't resist an academic opportunity, during her stint at the Utica College, Dr. Ghose pursued Masters in International Protection of Human Rights. An erudite academician, she has presented several papers on a spectrum of issues on national and international. She has also taken academic audit of several colleges under GGSIP University, Delhi.

We will continue to strive to live up to the standards that she has set in the department.

Events and Activities in the Department

ComEEDy Club

On 27 June 2017, students of Commerce pedagogy (B.Ed I and II year), attended a round table discussion on the theme ‘Paving the way for Inclusion through Commerce Education’. Ms. Priya Obhrai, PGT, DPS R K Puram and alumnus, 2015 led the discussion, sharing her experiences of engaging with a visually challenged student in the Accountancy classroom.

Other topics like the initiative of introducing Commerce subjects like book keeping at secondary level and the type of activities that can be done in Accountancy and Business Studies classes were also taken up at the meeting.



Orientation B.Ed

The orientation for B.Ed First Year was organised on 31st July 2017. The sessions started with a general introduction about the course with focus on its scope, importance and need. Misconceptions of the students were also addressed. Some of the seniors also shared their experiences about the course and the college. They also took the students to visit the college library, gymnasium, basketball court, and auditorium. Teachers also told about the School Contact Programme which gives exposure to visit schools and interact with children directly. Students were told that there are tutorial classes also which help the students to ask their doubts personally without hesitation.

Orientation B.Ed

Orientation for B.Ed First Year was held on 31st July, 2017. The day started with a Welcome Address by the HOD of the Department of Education, Dr. Vandana Ghai where she warmly welcomed and introduced the students to this exciting course and its curriculum. This was followed by orientation to various courses which was undertaken by some of the teachers. Students were also briefed about the EPC (Enhancement of Professional Capacity) Courses, Tutorials and Field Observations as part of the practicum. This in-depth understanding of the course structure served to prepare students for the various course requirements and fine tune their respective expectations from the course.



Workshop on Inquiry Approach in Science

A workshop on “Inquiry approach in Science” was conducted by the organization ‘Anweshika’ on 12 August 2017 for B.El.Ed First Year and Science students of B.Ed First and Second Year. Science is not only about expensive apparatus or teaching learning resource. This workshop helped the students to understand how students can use locally available resources around us for the effective transaction of the teaching-learning process of Science. Some of the topics covered include gravity, magnetism, light and its path, reflection and refraction.

Experiential Learning and Integrated Planning

A one day workshop was organised on 21 August 2017 for B.El.Ed Fourth Year students with Mirambika, with the aim of exploring new ideas of planning. The day included a lot of activities in and outside the classroom. The experienced faculty of Mirambika threw light upon the needs of a child, why is it important to become a good human being before seeing ourselves as teachers, how education cannot be done in isolation and it requires the overall development of a child. How learning outside the classroom is an amazing idea to be used with children and how it should get a direction, was also addressed.



‘Manthan’ by I am a Teacher

‘Manthan’ by ‘I am a Teacher’ held at The Heritage School, Vasant Kunj on 4 September 2017 focussed on the ‘power of mentoring and collaboration’. The students of B.El.Ed III year (Ms. Kausar Nisha, Ms. Neha Garg, Ms. Neeru Sharma, Ms. Maanshi Kumar and Ms. Meenakshi Sharma) developed insights on how collaboration is key survival skill in 21st century. Dr. Santosh Mathew, chairperson of NCTE, shed light on the status of recruitment of teachers. This was followed by ‘play stations’ where students got the opportunity to participate in various sessions like, Conflict resolution, App development, Photosynthesis in a fun way.

Workshop by Jodo Gyan Shiksha Kendra

A workshop was conducted for B.El.Ed Fourth Year students on 24 August 2017 by the members of ‘Jodo Gyan Shiksha Kendra’ (Ms. Sonal and Mr. Jalaj). Through the interactive and interesting workshop students got to learn how they can use various teaching learning materials like Rangometry, Ganit Mala, Maan Cards etc. to enhance children’s mathematical skills. Various concepts like Numbers, Number Operations, Shapes, and Fractions etc. were taken up by the resource persons through various interesting activities, games and storytelling. The workshop was aimed to demonstrate how Mathematics can be taught in an interesting and meaningful way.





Workshop on Teachers and Emotions

On 9 and 10 September 2017, students of B.Ed Second year attended a two-day exploratory workshop on “Teachers and Emotions: Exploring and addressing emotions in everyday school context”, at the Department of Education, University of Delhi. The aim of the workshop was to explore and address the emotions in everyday school context. The activities targeted spreading awareness about different emotions and how we can control prolonging and duration of these emotions. Teacher panelists talked about some of their most emotional moments in school, how they handled them, what are unsaid rules when it comes to expressing emotions as a teacher, emotional expectations as a woman, stereotypical notion of what women teachers are like, and how society perceives an ideal teacher.

Conference on Education Policy Shifts in Neo Liberal Times

Students of B.Ed Third Year attended a conference on core concerns and critical issues around Education Policy Shifts in Neo-Liberal Times, on 14 September, 2017 at Gargi College, University of Delhi. With insights on classroom discourse, curriculum issues and development of critical educators, the students got an opportunity to reflect upon the policy shifts affecting public education system and its implications on the employees working in the system. The contextualisation of the society in the light of the policy shifts proved to be helpful for the students to understand the system of education better. The conference was a great medium to learn more about the sphere of education.

Freshers' Welcome

The students of our department joined hands and extended their arms to give freshers a very warm hearted welcome on 15 September, 2017. The programme started with a poetry which conveyed the journey of Education Department, along with a warm welcome to fresh faces.

The programme included many performances in the form of songs, group dance, folk dance and yoga. B.Ed third year students performed a play which showed the journey of students in the college. The head of the department Dr. Vandana Ghai along with our senior teacher Dr. Sudipta Ghose also welcomed freshers with their kind words. Freshers also participated in the Ms. B.Ed and Ms. B.Ed contests. Ms. Shweta Bharadwaj and Ms. Barkha won the titles of Ms. B.Ed and Ms. B.Ed respectively. Several games were also organised for freshers as well as seniors.

Visit to National Accountancy Museum

Students of Pedagogy of Commerce and Economics of B.Ed First Year visited the National Accountancy Museum, Noida on 26 September 2017. The students were oriented towards the history of Accountancy and the progress in the profession of accounting since the establishment of Institute of Chartered Accountants of India. The museum curator, Dr. Nishant Ranjan, also discussed the trends in studies in Accountancy through the question papers of the previous years.

Joy of Learning

A science workshop was held on 13 October 2017 in Room No. 51 for B.Ed First Year. It was conducted by Joy of Learning Foundation. The topic of the workshop was Electricity. It helped us to explore concepts such as conduction of electricity through water, atoms and its structure. They also used different types of ribbons to show charges. This workshop was quite innovative and it helped us to gain knowledge unconventionally.



Workshop on Bringing the Text Alive in Classrooms

An interactive workshop was organised on 'Bringing the Text Alive in the Classroom' on 14 October 2017. The workshop aimed at facilitating the students of the pedagogy of English by acquainting them with theories and innovative strategies for effective teaching of literature in the classroom. The workshop included several cooperative and collaborative activities which made literature reading a shared experience as opposed to an individual one.

Experiential learning based on students' learning styles, forms of incorporating readers' response and use of audio visual resources to orient and elicit responses from students, all were explored through the workshop. Applied theatre especially the techniques of 'Tableau' and 'Collective Wheel' etc. were performed in collaborative groups bringing alive the literary texts of NCERT books.

Visit to Math Lab Kulachi Hansraj Model School


A visit to the Math Lab of Kulachi Hansraj Model School was organised on 11 October 2017 to help students of B.Ed First Year explore the Laboratory Approach to Teaching of Mathematics. The visit was facilitated by Ms. Rashmi Kathuria. She helped us explore the materials of the laboratory and gave insights on the use of ICT in teaching of Mathematics.

The learning in laboratory appeared child-centered and not teacher dominated. The students were carrying out the activities. The teacher appeared as a facilitator. Dominoes, Lego blocks, SOMA Cubes, Geometry Kits were shown to us and the importance of Interactive and hands – on approach was told. Multi-sensory aids present in the laboratory were discussed. Uses of applets, websites and web resources were shared. The visit was concluded by exploring math games.

International Conference

The Department of Education at Shyama Prasad Mukherji College organised an international conference on *Aligning Education Systems to meet the Challenges of the Future* from November 8-10, 2017. Conceptualised as a forum for deliberation on educational issues of the present and the future, by its convener Dr. Sudipta Ghose and co-convener Dr. Veena Kapur, the conference was attended by delegates from Germany, Syria, Zambia and the US besides participants from various parts of the country. Well known academician Prof. Shyam Menon (Vice Chancellor, Ambedkar University) was the Chief Guest of the programme who delivered the Keynote address. Prof. Namita Ranganathan (Head and Dean, Central Institute of Education, University of Delhi) presided over the inaugural session as the Chief Guest.

Mr. Arild Oksnevad, Counsellor, Head of Cooperation of the Royal Norwegian Embassy attended the event as an Esteemed guest. The conference had erudite speakers Prof. Jandhyala B.G. Tilak (Distinguished Professor, Council for Social Development), Prof. Ajaz Masih (Head and Dean, Faculty of Education, Jamia Millia Islamia) and Dr. Suman Kalia (retd. Associate Professor, SPMC) addressed the plenary sessions. With themes focussing on preparing students for emergent knowledge economies and equipping them with futuristic skills to meet the digital challenges in education while inculcating the ethics of peace and harmony, the conference was a successful in garnering diverse views on a common platform.



Trip to National Museum

On 31 October 2017, B.Ed First Year had an educational trip to National Museum that is situated at Central Secretariat. Right at the entrance, there's a huge carriage that sets our mind in the right frame for what's coming next.
