#### Recognising the Accomplishments of Students

We now boast of nineteen departments and over 3000 students.

The Department of Education was set up in 1977 offering a course in BA Programme. We started BElEd in 1996 and BEd in 2009. We are the only college to offer both BElEd and BEd in the University of Delhi. The expansion of our department owes to our dedicated faculty. Celebrating our glorious past, we have made a humble attempt to document teachers who have contributed to our department and trace them to where they are now. ## Events and Activities in the Department

### Orientation of B.Ed and B.El.Ed Students

The orientation programme for all the years of BElEd and BEd was organised in the months of July and August 2018. Owing to delayed admissions of BElEd and BEd First year students, orientation was organised after at least third admissions list of each course. Thus, Orientation programme was conducted in three phases.

Phase I: Orientation for BElEd II, III and IV years and BEd II year was conducted on 23 and 24 July 2018. The sessions included overview of the courses and specific orientation by subject teachers for various papers as well as for the practicum. Students of the senior years were also asked to interact with them to clarify doubts and provide an overview of what to expect in the coming year.

Phase II: Orientation of BElEd I year was organised on 02 August 2018. The session began with ice breaking and welcome by the faculty and Ms. Shuchita Tuli of BElEd IV year. This was followed by address by the HOD. An overview to the course and year was conducted by various faculty members. In the afternoon, senior students of the course provided them insights into the course and the college.

Phase III: Orientation of BEd I year was organised on 09 August 2018. The session began with an address by the HOD. Individual teachers took sessions for their respective papers and practicum. Students were also divided into subject based group for orientation to pedagogy courses. In the afternoon, students of senior years interacted with them to clarify doubts about the course.



## Soundscape Workshop



On 25 July 2018, students from various years of BElEd attended “Women's Water Stories” soundscaping workshop conducted by the resource person Ms. Jordan P. Woodward (Fulbright Scholar). The workshop circled around sound-mapping techniques using various water sounds. The students learned the application of the same technique through story-mapping, which can be used as a great classroom resource across various disciplines and tap the listening skills of learners. The workshop was a great success and Ms. Gauri Tiwari (BElEd II year), Ms. Ashmeet Kaur Bindra (BElEd IV year) and Ms. Shuchita Tuli (BElEd IV year) received certificates upon successful completion of the workshop.

## Jodo Gyan Workshop

The Jodogyan Workshop was held on 21 August 2018 for BElEd IV year students. The resource person, Ms. Sonal, helped students in developing deeper understanding of mathematical concepts and pedagogical aspects by simplifying the representation of mathematical ideas using their concrete resources and manipulatives. The focus of the workshop was to provide insightful and conceptual understanding to students using cost effective resources like rangometry, ganit mala, place value cards, fraction chart etc. Activities, group tasks and stories were also shared for learning concepts like counting, place value, fractions, symmetry and patterns.



## Theatre in Pedagogy Workshop



A session on the use of theatre as a pedagogical tool at elementary level was attended by students of BElEd IV year on August 24th, 2018. Led by Ms. Bharti, an alumnus of NSD and our college, the session helped students learn via experience. The activities were reflective and provided students with an opportunity to revisit the theatre sessions they've had in the past years. Ms. Bharti also helped the students with their queries by sharing her experiences from the classroom. Circle improvisation, freeze frames, footwear collage were some of the activities that not only help enhance the pedagogy of the teacher but also act as an aid when it comes to building cooperation and rapport among students. The session acted as a culmination of the theatre sessions of the past and helped the students in developing multi perspective of exploring theatre activities as a pedagogic tool.

## Workshop by Joy of Learning Organisation

A workshop 'Optics - Alternative Pedagogies' was conducted by the Joy of Learning Foundation for Science Pedagogy students of BEd and BElEd I year students on 25 August 2018. It was a very interactive session where the basics of Optics were cleared with the help of demonstrations and experiments. Simple phenomena of diffusion, scattering and formation of rainbow was shown. It was a great experience for the student teachers to learn about Optics in alternative ways.



## Freshers' Welcome

"It all started with dance and food" - Freshers' Welcome was the day of fun and frolic. This year our freshers' celebrated their welcoming party on 7 September 2018. And the aptly selected theme was "feminism". As tradition say, one should welcome new members with gifts and an open heart, the Education Department did the same. ### Festival of Voices Workshop

A workshop was organised by Mittika on 'Festival of Voices' on 8 September 2018 for BEEd II Years. Mr. Zubair and his team conducted the session which was quite interactive as it foregrounded a range of powerful stories of Delhi's women. These stories were depicted with the help of magic. Numerous magic spells like aajoo kajoo, abra ka dabra were enchanted by students. The session encompassed challenges faced by women in different spheres of life.



### Workshop by Anweshika Organisation



A workshop on 'Basics of Science' was conducted by an organization 'Anweshika' led by Dr. HC Verma, an eminent Physics professor for the Science pedagogy students of BEd and BEEd I year students on 11 September 2018. Introductory and basic concepts of Science of classes from 6th to 8th were discussed through simple demonstrations. Concepts such as Electricity, Magnetism, Pressure, Force and Air were discussed in light of simple daily life applications. It was a great experience for all the student teachers.

### Talk on Feminism and Feminist Theory

An enriching talk on Feminism and Feminist theories was organised on September 24th 2018 on Feminism and Feminist Theories. The resource person Dr. Ratna Raman, Associate Professor, Sri Venkateshwar College, University of Delhi, spoke of the idea of feminism and familiarised them with the history of feminism and its growing importance in current times. The students reflected on the discussion and shared their insights and experiences in the social space. The talk augmented students' knowledge and helped them to develop new perspectives about society and the role of feminism.

### Rally on Save Environment



A rally on "Save Environment" was organised on 26 September 2018, for raising awareness in society about the major cause "Global Warming". All the students of BEEd 1st year took part in the rally carrying many posters with slogans, such as "Save Earth, Save Environment", bringing forth major concerns related to the environment.

### Conference on Simone de Beauvoir

Alliance Française de Delhi in association with the Jindal Global University and Apne Aap organized a daylong conference on “Simone De Beauvoir” on 26 October 2018. Organized at M.L. Bhartia Auditorium to celebrate the 70th Anniversary of “The Second Sex”, the conference was attended by B.Ed I year students. With ‘gender’ being a significant aspect of our lives, this conference on feminist and existentialist philosopher, Simone de Beauvoir was very pertinent. The conference helped in having better understanding of the trajectory towards contemporary feminism. Ms. Urvashi Butalia, the keynote speaker, introduced the students with startling real life examples of strong Indian women who stood for themselves despite all odds. She also talked about some examples with reference to the expanding horizons of the ongoing #MeToo Movement. Prof. Anup Dhar also gave brilliant insights on Beauvoir’s concept of a female ‘body’. He also helped in understanding the Beauvoir’s famous quote “one is not born, but rather becomes, a woman” from an existentialist perspective. The closing session was addressed by Mr. Ashis Nandy whose works have been a part of Delhi University’s curricula of several disciplines.

### Session on ‘Vedic Mathematics’

A session was organised on ‘Vedic Mathematics’ for the BElEd I year students and mathematics pedagogy students of BEd I year on 15 November 2018. It was conducted by math-magician Mr. Saurabh Jain. It included much of student interaction as well as some amazing math tricks. He showed various tricks which can be used in day-to-day life making tedious calculations much quicker. The students thoroughly enjoyed the session and explored possibilities of using them in their field experiences.



A seminar was organised on Internet and E-safety for Students, Teachers and Teacher Educators by FLAIR on 12 November 2018. Dr. Deepa Idnani convened this seminar and the sessions were conducted by Dr Abdul Matin, Mr Ajay Kumar Sinha and Ms. Chinn. These sessions covered essential topics like digital footprints, data safety, cyber bullying, child safety laws etc. BElEd II and III year students attended the seminar and it was an engrossing session for all the participants.

### Visit to Reading Caterpillar Library



On 19 December 2018, BElEd II year students visited the 'Reading Caterpillar Library'. The visit was coordinated by Ms. Rituparna Ghosh. The visit helped students in exploring wide spectrum of story books of different writers. They experienced method of reading aloud stories for children. It was an enriching experience for all.

### Visit to Language Lab, NC Jindal Public School

The students of BElEd III year and B.Ed I year students of language pedagogy visited the Language Laboratory of NC Jindal Public School, Punjabi Bagh. Major emphasis was on use of ICT for language development. The facilitators demonstrated the use of the equipment in the language lab, especially the students' listening posts. The focus of the session was on phonetics and few 4th graders joined the interns in the lab practicing the sounds, answering questions put to them by their facilitators. The visit served to familiarize the students with the set-up, equipment and the pedagogic activities possible in a language lab.



### Beyond the Classroom Programme

Like the past couple of years, we continued with reaching out to the community through our Beyond the Classroom Programme. Students of our department taught Art and Craft skills to students of various departments of our college under NSS. Equipped with these new abilities, NSS students then went out to help young children in primary schools around the college learn these skills. This year we engaged with two schools: MCD School, Road No. 66, Punjabi Bagh (W), and MCD School No. 1, Madipur Village.
