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The department teachers and students continued to work with full fervour under the inchregeship of Dr. Gagandeep Bajaj.

The academic session saw over hundred admissions in B.Ed and B.El.Ed courses. The admissions took place through a centralised entrance test in both courses. The college, along with the University, shifted towards a more automated system of admissions, including online college allocation. Usual policy on reservation was followed towards building a more inclusive setup of education.

Students admitted in the courses belong to diverse backgrounds. In B.El.Ed I year, 34 students are from Humanities, 10 from Commerce, and 04 from Science backgrounds. Further, 12% students are from outside Delhi, including states Himachal Pradesh, Haryana, and Bihar.

In B.Ed, the distribution of seats is across Science, Social Science, Language, and Other Subjects including Commerce. Students have completed graduation and post graduation from many universities across the country including, Bihar, Rohtak, IGNOU, and Amity.

Besides academics, the students have also been actively involved in many co-scholastic activities. Ms. Deepthi, B.El.Ed has been a state level athlete. Some students in B.Ed have also learnt French and Spanish. Another is a trained dancer in Bharatnatyam and one in Kathak.

In the second phase, activities are being conducted throughout the 2016-17 academic year with school students towards helping them with homework, promoting gender sensitization, and spreading environmental awareness, through art and craft activities and puppet shows.

Students of B.Ed.Ed I year and Pedagogy of Science of B.Ed I year visited National Science Centre, Pragati Maidan on 27 March 2016 and 21 January 2016 respectively. The visit was enriching in providing insights into application of everyday science activities in teaching practice. Students also learnt the importance of developing a scientific temperament.



Mr. George Abraham, founding chairman of World Blind Cricket Council and Association for Cricket for the Blind in India, talked about how disability is seen as a handicap. He critiqued the education system on grounds of its inability to provide a platform to everyone. While narrating incidents from his own life, he highlighted the importance of caregivers and right timing in helping overcome the toughest challenges of life.



Pedagogy of Commerce students of B.Ed I year went for field visit to National Accountancy Museum of India, Noida on 11 April 2016. The visit helped students to understand the socio-historical context of Accountancy. They also visited Gowarsons Printing Press, Mayapuri with an aim to link a rhetorical understanding of Business Studies with real world practices. Mr. Deepak Kapoor, the entrepreneur of the press, also focussed on the relevance of Commerce education for promoting ethical business practices.



A workshop was organised on "Fabric Painting" for the students on 29th July 2016. Ms. Hema Mehra, the resource person from Pidilite, organised and conducted the session. The students of B.Ed. and B.Ed.Ed courses showed high participation in the same. Ms. Hema, who is also an entrepreneur owning her own line of artistic clothing, oriented the students to the art of Fabric Painting with the help of various techniques.

Students of Pedagogy of Social Science of B.Ed I year visited Gandhi Samriti in the month of March, 2016. The educational visit was an enriching experience as students understood the relevance of museums in developing a historical perspective and built a stronger understanding of the vision of Gandhi.



An Interactive session was organised 'Feminism and Capitalist Patriarchy' with Mr. Ashwin Bajaj, Assistant Professor, Gargi College. He helped us to understand what feminism can mean, the various movements of feminism and how capitalism plays a major role in perpetuating patriarchy. The interaction also dealt with how Capitalism not only exploits the productive labour but also completely devalues reproductive labour.


Pedagogy of Mathematics Students of B.Ed I year attended a session with Ms. Rashmi Kathuria at Kulachi Hansraj Model School. The visit was fruitful in the exposure it provided to an innovative Maths Lab. Ms. Kathuria also discussed the role of teachers in conducting project work. She also discussed the use of technology to teach abstract concepts till secondary level, enhance mathematical thinking, and promote collaborative and cooperative learning.



A workshop on teaching learning aids in Science was conducted by Anweshika, a teachers' collective that works towards bringing innovation in Physics teaching. The workshop was successful in providing hands on experience to students and compelling them to think about applying theoretical concepts in practice.



A workshop on 'Lexical approach to English Language teaching' was conducted by Prof. Rama Meganathan from NCERT for Pedagogy of English students of B.Ed and Pedagogy of Language students of B.Ed on 22<sup>nd</sup> August, 2016. The workshop involved the students in various activities that they could conduct in their classes at the primary and secondary levels. It included activities on information gap, word association and building compound words.



A two day workshop was organised on Storytelling and its Pedagogical Uses on 16-17 August, 2016 for B.Ed IV years. Story Selection, Story Experience, Story Presentation, Student Involvement, Story Telling Aids, Class Set up and follow up activities were some of the facets which were focussed upon by Ms. Rituparna Ghosh.

A Self Defence Workshop was organised on 29-30 August 2016. The chief instructor was Ms. Erum Nsim Khan, Judo and Self Defense Coach by profession. The event was divided into three hourly slots per day including specific sessions for students. The workshop was a positive step towards developing self-reliant women in the Indian society who react instead of panic, in case of assault.



A workshop was conducted by JODO GYAN. Ms. Pooja and Ms. Deepika presented materials for teaching Mathematics in primary classes. This included Rangometry Kit, Ganitmala, Fraction Kit, etc. The discussion also addressed the use of multiple resource materials to teach one concept.

On 12th September 2016, Dr. Jyoti Sharma, Associate Professor, CIC,DU oriented B.Ed students on the relevance of maintaining profiles for enriching teaching learning process and assessment. A learner's profile includes knowing about the learner, accessing their existing learning records and managing them.

A guest lecture on Errors in Second Language Learning was held for B.Ed II year, on 26 February 2016. Mr. Chetan, MPhil Linguistics, used Touchie's work for emphasizing the significance of understanding learner's errors in second language learning. He discussed types and sources of errors and general guidelines for teachers for correcting errors.

## Feature on some of our Alumni



Ms. Manisha Dabas (B.Ed, 2014) chose to work further in the field of security and joined CISF, as a Sub Inspector.




