
NAME OF THE EVENT: Self Defense Workshop

BRIEF DESCRIPTION: The Medical committee organised a talk by a reputed gynecologist, Dr. Nahid on 'Women Health Related Issues' who works in Max Hospital. She addressed the students about Gender inequality, in both biological, environmental and social terms, which makes women more vulnerable to certain risks, leading to poorer outcomes. These issues need special attention through independent programs that will be distinct from men's health. She also suggested how women provide the bulk of healthcare worldwide, both in the formal healthcare setting as well as in the informal sector and in the home. Yet women's own needs for healthcare are poorly addressed, especially among rural and poor communities.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION:

On the occasion of Annual Day, the students of Thirkan- The Dance Society of SPMC presented a dance drama depicting the experiences of a young girl across life stages in front of the dignitaries presented, faculty members and students. The narrative encompasses the young girl's experience of the Navrasas: *Vaatsalya, Haasya, Bhayaanaka, Adbhuta, Raudra, Vibhatsa*,



Karuna, Veera, Shringaara, Shaanta. The dance drama was an ensemble of three classical Indian dance forms- Kathak, Bharatnatyam, and Mohiniattam. The performance showed the struggle, indomitable courage and will of girl to live who had been a victim of acid attack. It was aesthetically moving with a brilliant narrative wrought in the dance drama tradition.

Storyline of the Dance Drama:

The young child experiences the warmth of her mother's love (*Vaatsalya*), and joy and happiness with her friends (*Haasya*). The carefree nature of childhood is marred by the fear of examinations (*Bhayaanaka*). But exams too fail to dampen her spirits as she sets out to explore the wonder of nature (*Adbhuta*). It is not always a smooth sail and life brings with it some negative experiences. The protagonist receives some unwanted attention, rejecting which leads to the man unleashing his wrath on her (*Raudra*). Victim of an acid attack, the young girl experiences a sense of disgust and rejection from self and society (*Vibhatsa*), and undergoes a period of great sorrow (*Karuna*). However, she soon realises that it is not outward but inner beauty that is important. Courage is not just in fighting against the society, but also in overcoming one's own fears and accepting oneself for who we truly are (*Veera*). Having accepted herself, she also finds acceptance in a meaningful relationship and begins to enjoy the beauty of life (*Shringaara*). In harmony with self and others, her life moves ahead with peace and contentment (*Shaanta*).





NAME OF THE EVENT: A theatrical performance titled "A Woman Alone" by Arvind Gaur
