
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### Assessment of Programme Outcome and Course Outcome attainment

Programme Outcome (POs) and Course Outcome (COs) are evaluated through direct and indirect assessment methods. Course Outcomes (COs) are aligned with Programme Outcomes (POs) and Programme Specific Outcomes (PSOs), serving as quantitative indicators of how effectively these POs and PSOs are being achieved. For calculating the attainment of COs, 80% weightage is given to direct methods and 20% to indirect methods.

#### Direct Assessment

The direct method involves Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) and semester-end examinations, with CIA contributing 30% (25 Marks of Evaluation based on performance + 5 marks for attendance) and semester-end exams contributing 70% to the overall assessment. However, with the introduction of NEP 2020, the scheme and assessment criteria had been changed. Presently Internal Assessment component is 75 and External Assessment is 90. CIA comprises class test, assignments, class activities (such as project work, seminars, group discussions, role-play, quizzes, and presentations. Additionally, question papers are designed according to Bloom's Taxonomy, which classifies educational objectives into six cognitive levels: Remembering, Understanding, Applying, Analyzing, Evaluating, and Creating.

Each assessment component, including mid-term exams, assignments, and class activities, is linked to specific COs, with the overall attainment based on an average mark set as the target for final attainment.

## Indirect Assessment

Indirect assessment is conducted through a mentorship programmes, tutorials and Students Satisfactory Survey. The course teacher is responsible for conducting the CIA, maintaining records of the results from CIA, and mapping each students' progression in the classroom. Generally, CO attainment is calculated based on the percentage of students scoring more than 60% (equivalent to 6-grade points on a 10-point scale) in each question.

There are four levels of attainment used in both direct and indirect assessments:

### Direct Assessment Levels:

1. Level 3: 80% of students attain more than 60% marks - 3.0
2. Level 2: 60% of students attain more than 60% marks - 2.0
3. Level 1: 50% of students attain more than 60% marks - 1.0
4. Level 0: Less than 50% of students attain more than 60% marks - 0.0

Indirect assessment is performed through exit surveys, ensuring a comprehensive evaluation of how well the course outcomes are met. The survey is structure with a threshold set on whether they are satisfied with the teaching learning processes as well as teacher's assessment on students' progression:

The performance of course outcomes is used to determine the level of attainment of the POs and PSOs. Each course outcome are aligned with at least one of the defined POs and PSOs. COs are mapped to POs and PSOs with weights assigned as follows:

- **3:** Strong correlation
- **2:** Medium correlation
- **1:** Weak correlation
- **0:** No correlation

The attainment of POs is calculated based on the level of mapping between COs and POs and the CO attainment level.

Overall result analysis according to division obtained by students in various courses.




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


On the basis of responses received, following observations are made:

- About 17% of students believe that the curriculum is too demanding and prevents them from striking a balance between theory and practice.






On the basis of responses received, following observations are made:

A total of 12 questions were asked to the students on the various aspects like teaching style and content delivery, understanding of the concepts, guiding and encouraging the students etc.







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


- Only 28% of the students have registered for the placement cell. Awareness for the placement cell should be improved as most of the students are not aware of the placement cell.
