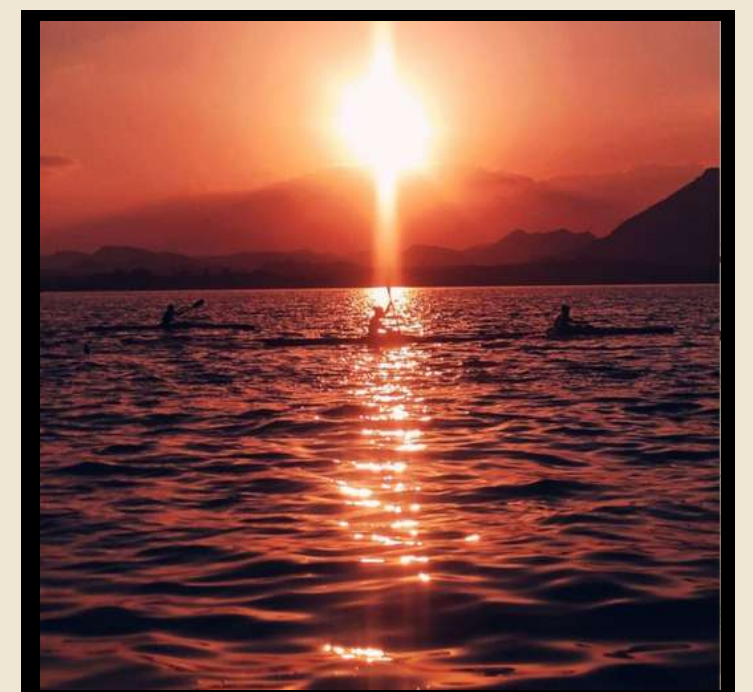

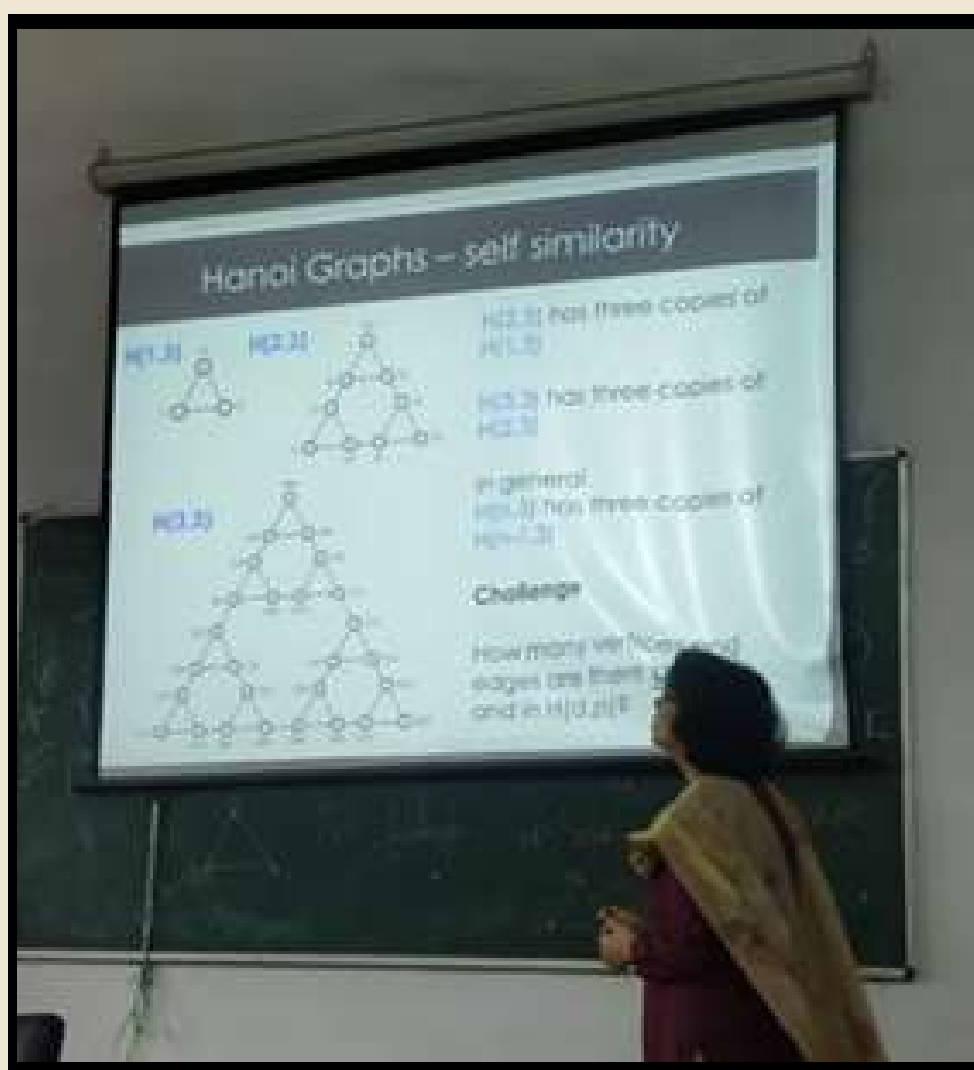
Workshop on Mental Health and Well-being for All: A Global Priority

The resource person facilitated us through the process of problem-solving and helped us direct our thinking toward the solution of the problem.

English Language Teaching Workshop

She laid importance on the use of simple informative materials such as wrappers and food packets, etc., and how easily they can be used as TLMs.

Expanding the Domain of Indian Languages in Mathematics and Science

A seminar titled 'Expanding the Domain of Indian Languages in Mathematics and Science' was jointly organised by Department of Education and Mathematics on 18 November 2022. Several sessions were held which featured several eminent speakers. Prof Anita Rampal, keynote speaker, emphasised that teaching should be done in a way where opportunities are given to children to use their own language and logic. She stressed that teaching should be inclusive which gives space for multiculturalism. Prof Shobha Bagai stressed the importance of being bilingual. She shared that language barrier creates distance between learning and its expression. Dr Chandan Srivastav representing "Bhartiya Bhasha" said that education should be in Indian languages and New Education Policy 2020 is giving importance to Indian languages. He shared that Bhartiya Bhasha Divas will be celebrated on December 11 every year to promote and celebrate the diversity of Indian languages. Prof. K Ramasubramanian dwelt on the Golden Age of Indian Mathematics and Science. Dr Ajay Kumar Chaudhary, Prof Gurjeet Kaur, Prof Prajakti Gokhale, Dr Veena Dhingra, and Prof Yukti Sharma presented their insights on different themes, such as 'Exploring aesthetics of mathematics through linguistic



approach', 'Relatedness of mathematics to real life', etc. Dr Haneet Gandhi drew the attention of the audience towards mathematics in real life. This invigorating session prompted the audience to observe their natural surroundings with mathematical appreciation. Mathematical problems were beautifully presented in the form of different poem puzzles by Prof Gokhale. The session was concluded by justifying the use of regional languages for teaching mathematics. In the end, there was an insightful panel discussion under the chairmanship of Dr Parmesh Sharma and each speaker ended the discussion with concluding remarks. These remarks emphasised a multilingual approach to learning, the need for academic translations, sharing of research work as well as the need to develop vernacular languages to deal with concepts in the higher classes.

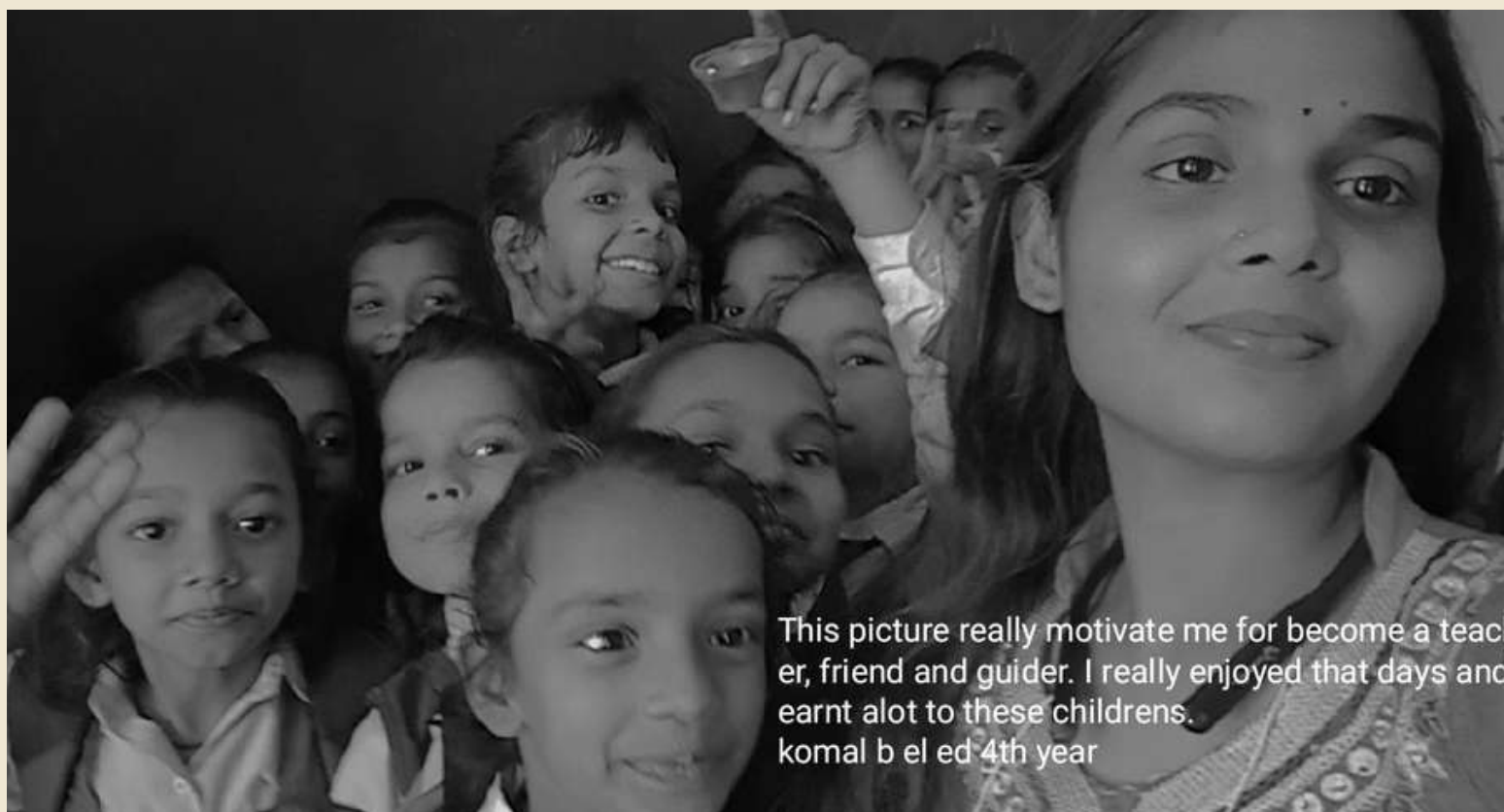

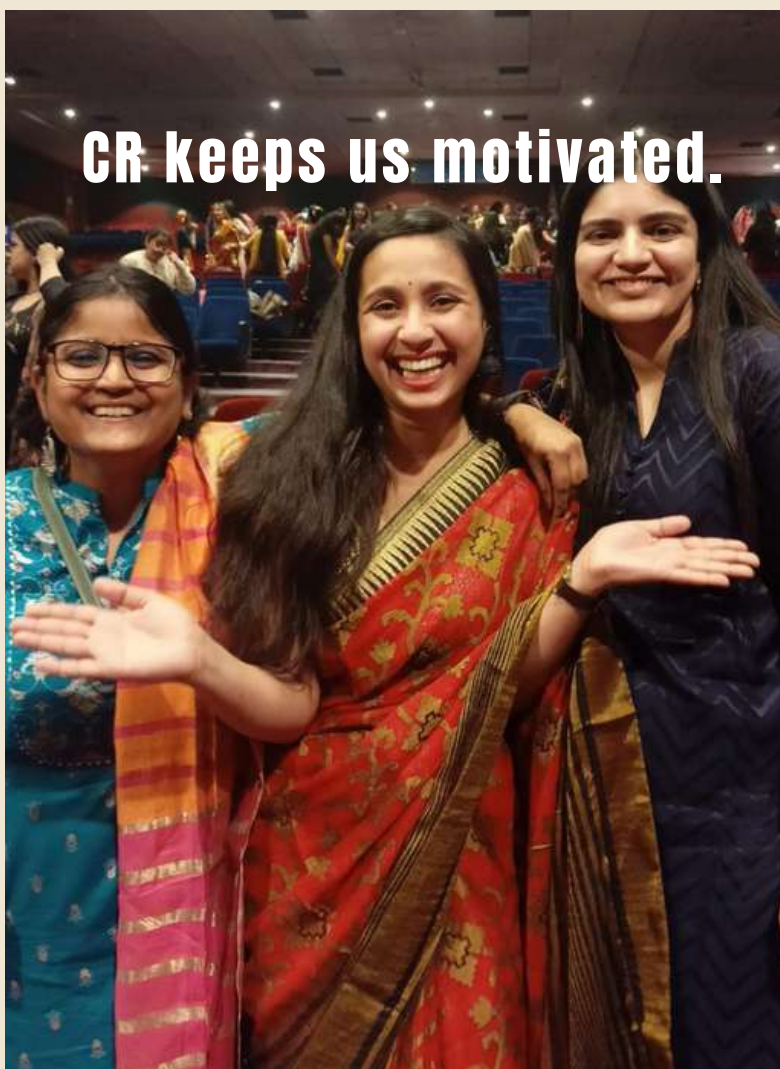

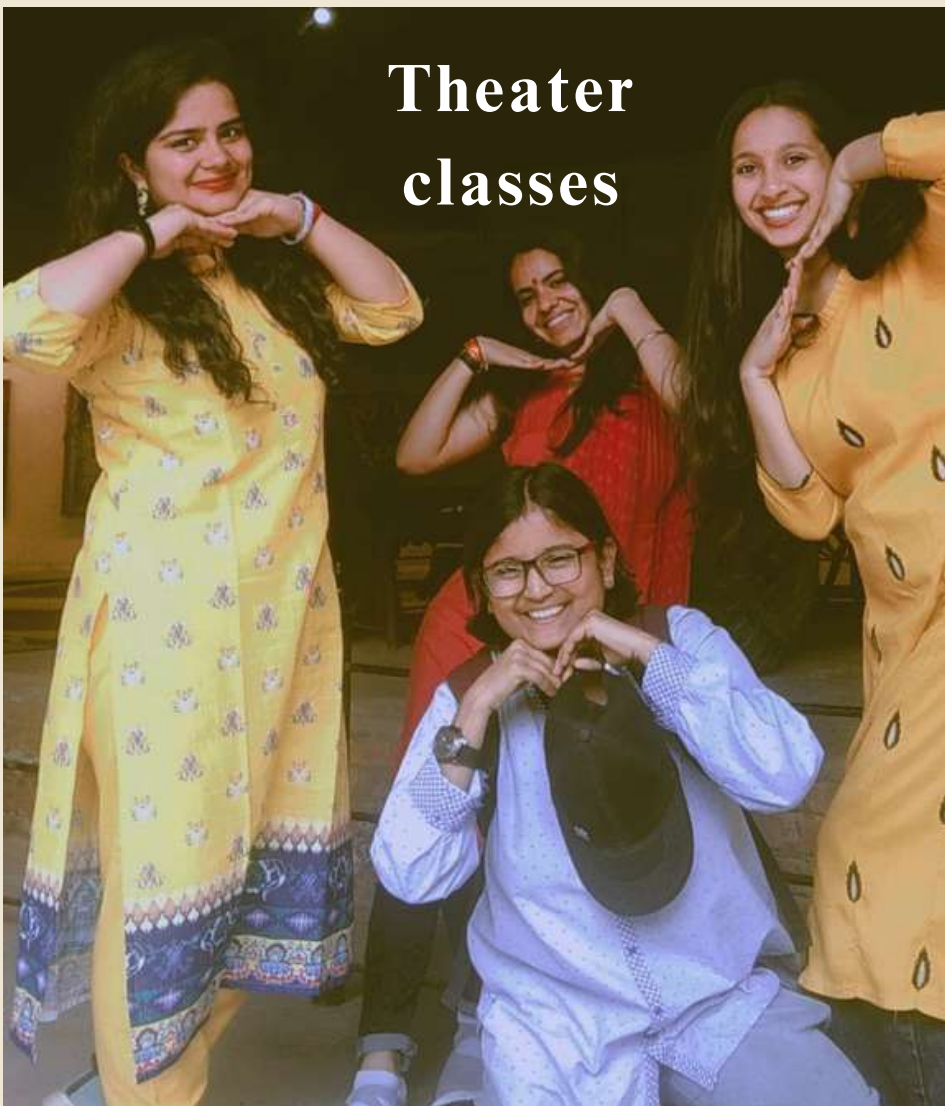
