• Using India's public expenditure data, various techniques have incorporated, such as time-series regression analysis, unit root tests, cointegration techniques, and vector error correction model in this paper. The results showed a positive elasticity of growth rate in expenditure to the first difference of per-capita GDP with some modification in the theoretical model proposed by researchers.

parameters of equality. The research highlighted the tangible impacts of equality perceptions on community dynamics, and initiated transformative actions which resulted in enhanced community interdependence, diversified nutritional intakes, and collective economic activities.
