24. Brief Report:

The Department of Geography, Shyama Prasad Mukherji College for Women and IQAC, successfully organized a seminar on ‘AatmaNirbhar Bharat’ to commemorate 75 years of Indian Independence. The seminar was glorified by the words of our distinguished speakers.

The session was initiated by a small “Lighting of the Lamp” ceremony by the distinguished guests and Principal Madam before invoking Goddess Saraswati to seek her blessings followed by the opening remarks of the Principal Prof. Sadhna Sharma. Highlighting the importance being a self-reliant nation on the road to development she emphasized on the challenges we need to overcome to tread this path and the requirement of consistent effort in this direction. The Teacher-In-Charge of the Department, Dr. Rachna Dua motivated the students to be a rallying part of building an AatmaNirbhar India. She highlighted the foundational role of MSMEs in contributing towards building a self-reliant and independent youth which can help them tap their creative potentials to the maximum.

Prof. Kaushal Kumar Sharma, CRSD, JNU, presented his views on the theme “AatmaNirbhar Bharat: A way forward through Social Entrepreneurship” and stressed on the importance of India becoming self-sufficient through social entrepreneurship which not only assures economic gains but leads to community development as well. He covered various topics about the self-sustainable goals and the huge potential of

India's youth for leading India to become a global market. He highlighted four essential principles of Social Entrepreneurship – Bhawana, Kalpana, Yojana and Sadhana.

Ms. Ilma Afroz, IPS, GOI, speaking on the theme “Role of Youth in Nation Building” laid emphasis on the importance of self-motivation and self-will. She highlighted the role of higher education in shaping the personality and overall development of a student beyond the four walls of a classroom. She encouraged students to build their confidence, stay motivated toward their goals and talked about the role of civil servants towards nation-building beyond demarcated duties. She encouraged everyone to learn from people around them and to inculcate their expertise in their own lives.

Prof. Vandana Mishra, Dept. of EVS, University of Delhi, highlighted the tradeoff between economy and environment. Taking a reference to textile industry, she highlighted the environmental costs of development in context of "fashion justice" which relies of utilizing the entire cost (including social, economic and environmental) of a garment such that we experience a change in consumer behavior and contribute to long-term sustainable development

The sessions were moderated by Dr. Gargi Kar Majumdar and Q&A session was conducted at the end of each talk where interesting questions were put forward by the students and faculty members of the Department making the program more interactive and enriching for everyone. The session concluded with a Vote of Thanks by the Convener of the Program, Mr. Aakash Upadhyay.

24. Brief Report: 150-200 words

‘Dhara’, the Geography Society organized ‘Voice of Reason’ an Inter-departmental event on 12th January on the occasion of ‘National Youth Day’ to commemorate Swami Vivekananda’s birth anniversary. The event had two segments. ‘Catalysts of Change’ - a talk show where two extraordinary speakers were invited. Miss Devanshi Ranjan, who is a social worker and the recipient of Diana Award for her great initiative to empower underprivileged children, especially girl students, with their academic work during the COVID-19 pandemic. And, Miss Nilanjana Parijat, who is a Holistic Wellness Psychologist, Educator and Mentor at Reboot Wellness and has a master's degree in Psychosocial- Clinical Psychology from Ambedkar University, Delhi.

The Talk show covered a spectrum of topics which focused on the Youth today. Miss Devanshi acknowledged the fact that the youth can transform their frustration into motivation to work. She said that often we tend to escape from reality. To deal with the escapism, she said that one has to be determined and has to set their own set of standards for productivity.

To make social media a safe space, she advised that we need to have control over social media and not give too much power to it. Speaking about her work she focused on having a passion to do the right thing. She spoke about having goals in life and working towards it.

Miss Nilanjana appreciated the passion and enthusiasm that the young people have in them to transform society. She quoted Swami Vivekananda and mentioned that his ideology was based on service towards other but self-service was also there. She urged everyone to recognize the unhealthy pattern in lifestyle and bring balance in life. The stress should be dealt then and there and to have power over our own thoughts. Believe in exactly what one wants and put their best foot forward. She concluded her words with her motto of life: Life without passion is life unlived.

This segment was concluded by taking up queries from the audience where the speakers addressed mental health issue, gender stigma in fields, life-work balance, importance of communication.

The next segment of the event was 'Spoken Words' competition and the topic for the same was 'My Role Model'. Videos of the participants were displayed where they expressed the spirit of their role model through poetry, monologue, solo act etc. The following students were announced as winners:






-) It was a successful event and all the students enjoyed and had a gala time.




Virtual dance performance by students of 2nd and 3rd year



61. Methodology: Oral presentation

62. Outcomes:

- The river whispers values to the mankind. The dynamic body of water which infiltrates our heart with new experiences. The dynamic flow of river indicates it's dynamic in nature which is subjected to changes at various locations. Similarly, mankind needs to adapt itself to the positive changes that they are countering in life. Resisting change could disrupt their own balance.
- Over the decades it has been evident that humans have considered rivers as sacred. Most ancient civilizations globally were born along rivers. The rivers have changed its course but the cultures stayed. The culture of respecting rivers has continued to be an integral part of Indian culture.
- Sanskrit has always reiterated through it's shlokas that, 'water is life' and rivers defined our lifestyle, traditions, customs and above all has acted as a source of inspiration. It is an hour to change 'sustainable development from a principle to action' in our social space.
- Disasters due to river action are today also influenced by anthropogenic activities. Just as an individual when struck with adverse situation, his/her daily life becomes disrupted and becomes grief-stricken, the same applies for rivers. Their natural

flow is changed or blocked to satisfy human needs. Rivers have never naturally met their violent end rather they are forced by human greed.

- The intrinsic value of river must be known by everyone. Prof. Ravi Tekchandani pointed that Samlagnata (attachment) and Samrasta (harmony) are high ideals of life taught by rivers. A collective action from all disciplines should be taken to safeguard rivers.
- The journey of a river is same as that of a human. As soon as the river originates, its destiny is known. The river knows its faith. The path through which it flows is accepted by it. In the same way, human beings run after their final destiny, the goal he/she has set in his/her life.
- It is often believed that a river loses its identity once it meets the ocean but more rightly it attains a new identity. Similarly, when a human finally achieves his/her dream, he/she transforms into a new person. Changes will be there once a dream is achieved, but it is important to embrace those changes rather than resisting it.
- The challenges that impel upon life should be seen as an opportunity rather than an obstacle. River often encounter obstacles while flowing as it turns around them or cuts right through it. Human tendency should be the same. It should not repel against challenges. The only way through it is to tackle them down.
- Water expresses itself in the same way as humans do. Respecting the water resources, considering them our own and having an affectionate attitude is the need of the hour.
- Innovations and technologies have supported manifold increase of population in a limited time frame during present times. Resources have limited renewal rate owing to massive human dependence. An imbalance between human needs and human dependence has led to exploitation of resources of commonality like river.

It's the need of the hour to imbibe values to conserve rivers mainly the highlands which are sources or first orders of a river system.



69. Brief Report: 150-200 words

Department of Geography, Shyama Prasad Mukherji College for Women in collaboration with Bhartiya Shikshan Mandal organized a one day National Seminar on the topic 'Nadi Ko Jano: Human- River relationship- A Socio- Cultural-Environmental Perspective in the

21st century under the auspices of an ambitious initiative by Central government with the name 'Nadi ko Jano' to create a comprehensive database on river resource of the nation and to spread awareness about the maintenance of cordial interrelationship between human- river through means of several activities and competitions held under the theme.

The seminar/webinar was held under the patronage of Honourable Principal ma'am Dr. Sadhna Sharma , wherein Sri Shankarananda Ji, Rastriya Sah Sanghthan Mantri at Bharatiya Shikshan Mandal made his auspicious presence at the seminar as the Chief Guest of the day, Prof. Ravi Tekchandani graced the seminar as the Guest of Honour and Prof. Tejbir Singh from Shivaji College, Delhi University was invited as the keynote speaker.

Honourable Principal ma'am welcomed the guests with mementos, Prof. Ranjan Tripathi Deputy Dean, Colleges, University of Delhi honoured them with shawls and Dr. Rachna Dua presented them planters that are symbol of life, growth and dynamism. Following it was a ceremonial song in Sanskrit called 'Sangachadwam' marking the importance of unity (which is a strength and key to meaningful life) presented by the students of Department of Music. Another piece of art, was a presentation of Bhatiyali (ভাটিয়ালি) genre of music, taking its essence from the soils of Bengal, played on sitar by the students of the college. This was followed by the lighting of the lamp ceremony by the guests.

The First part of the session was moderated by Dr. Shivani George ma'am. The Principal Dr. Sadhna Sharma in her inaugural address urged audience to listen keenly to the values that rivers whisper to mankind, a dynamic body of water which infiltrates our heart with new experiences whenever we put our finger into it, this teaches us to become dynamic with changing conditions. Civilizations may change on it's shores but the culture and bond never does. It has been an intrinsic part of Indian culture to consider rivers as revered.

Prof, Ranjan Tripathi left a great imprint on minds and thoughts of audience highlighted that Sanskrit always asserted through shlokas that, 'water is life' and rivers give us lifestyle, traditions, customs and above all inspiration. Sir concluded it by quoting that, it is an hour to change 'sustainable development from a principle to action' in our social space.

Prof. Ravi Tekchandani Sir remarked that 'rivers are dear to all but, dearest to geographers only' because studying them is part of their learning. His brainstorming session invoked the minds of the audience when he pointed that the past few decades have witnessed an increased incidence of disasters relating to rivers. It is important to acknowledge the intrinsic value of rivers and their services to mankind. He said samlagnata (attachment) and samrasta (harmony) are high ideals of life taught by rivers and thus urged for a collective action from all disciplines to safeguard rivers. He also presented a copy of a book authored by him 'Saryu se Sindhu' to the Principal.

Sri Shankarananda Ji gave a speech where his energetic speech filled the audience with a lot of enthusiasm. The journey of a river is same as that of a human. As soon as the river originates, its destiny is known i.e. meeting the sea. Human beings also need to understand their way forward and follow a path that would lead them to their goals. Sir mentioned about Dr. Masaru Emoto, a Japanese scientist, who claimed water has memory and emotions, its molecular structure changes after being exposed to different emotions. He gave the idea of 'Spardha nahi Sangathan' (no competition, only cooperation) to support the idea of river conservation. He made a rhetorical claim 'to protect the world, to protect India (which is a peace-loving country, teaching practice of harmonious lifestyle) and protect its rivers'.

During the second session, Mr. Prem Prakash Sir, demonstrated the use of 'Nadi ko Jano' App for filling in river data.

Prof. Tejbir Singh Rana Sir presented an in-depth geographical picture of the discussions going around human- river relationship, with his case studies and research experiences. He highlighted the depleting capacities of resources to replenish themselves in the event of rising human needs. The case studies of Jokri kalan village of Jodhpur and Beetal village in Nagaur were compared, which produced contrasting pictures, with latter as an exemplar for watershed management system. He mentioned the ambitious Kalsara dam project by government in Gujarat, on completion which would contribute to make world's largest man- made portable water lake in a water deficit state and salt intrusion- affected state like Gujarat. Calling student- attendees as children of the millennium, who would guide way through it, he urged them to imbibe values to conserve rivers mainly the highlands which are sources or first orders of a river system.


